INTRODUCTION

Going Global is excited to go back to Zimbabwe, Africa! Thank you for considering this trip!

It is our hope that this mission experience will lead each of you into a deeper understanding of Christ's love, grace and a greater understanding of His call to go into all the world and share the gospel.

Please understand that you are visiting a third world country. The culture and their way of life is probably not what you are accustomed to. We ask that you just be patient and courteous of the locals and those you are traveling with.



TRIP PURPOSE

Our prayer is that this trip will be impactful not only for those in Zimbabwe, but for those traveling there as well. The trip will consist of Ministry Teams for street evangelism, Medical Projects within the established clinic, crop harvesting at Chivu Farm, and food distribution and teams helping at Goshen farm with the school and orphanage.

COST BREAKDOWN

At Going Global, we are committed to keeping our trip costs as low as possible so that more people can join with us as we empower the powerless and give identity to the faceless!

TOTAL TRIP - \$2,950

The total cost for one person to travel on the Going Global Zimbabwe trip is \$2,950.00. Here are important payment dates:

- Non-refundable Application Fee - \$50
- \$900 Down Payment 1/12/22
- \$2,000 Final Payment 3/1/22

DOWN PAYMENT

Your down payment for the Zimbabwe trip covers all of your in-country cost. All checks for down payments must be made to Going Global. Your down payment covers:

- Hotel room & food
- Vehicle rental, driver, & fuel

The final \$2,000 payment will be utilized to purchase your plane ticket. (Pricing is tentative.)

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Refund policy on DOWN PAYMENT of \$900 goes as follows:

- Full refund 60 days prior to departure
- Half Refund 50-30 days from departure
- NO REFUND 29-0 days from departure

Extra expense's that are optional but encouraged that IS NOT a part of your down payment are tips to hired drivers, and Interpreters. Any spending money you wish to bring will also be an added expense.

TRIP DETAILS

We fly out of Nashville, Tennessee on April 11th (land on the 12th) Fly out of Harare, Zimbabwe on April 20th (land in the US on the 21st)



HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

This trip is going to be around \$2800-3000 per person. At this time the plane ticket is \$1900.00 round-trip, this price is subject to change until your ticket is purchased. Julia Daley will be in charge of arranging the tickets all at one time. Other expenses incurred on this trip is housing, vehicle rentals, fuel, food, driver, visa.

WHEN IS PAYMENT DUE?

Down payment in the amount of \$900.00 is due 1/12/23. This down payment is for accommodations, food, fuel, van rental and driver (keep in mind this is only an estimate) The airline tickets will be purchased 3/1/23. You can take a credit card on the trip with you but the only place you will be able to use it is in the airports. CASH is the only thing we can use in Zimbabwe. We will NOT have to convert money. It is wise to bring more small bills than large ones.

WHERE WILL I SLEEP?

We will be staying at a bed and breakfast owned by some friends of the ministry. It is in a gated and guarded community. Typically, we break shared accommodations up by gender. (If you are married traveling with your spouse you may not get to sleep together depending on room arrangements and trip size.)

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR?

For church services men should wear slacks, jeans are acceptable with a nice shirt, tie is optional. Pastor Daley will wear a suit at one of the churches and a sports coat with jeans at the others. Women should wear skirts or dresses for church service. Jeans and capri's are acceptable for travel. If you are helping the dental/medical team, please bring scrubs. Pack modestly for your bedtime.

Wear and pack comfortable shoes - we will be walking alot. Flip flops are good especially around the house. Laundry can be done at the homes we are staying in for an additional cost.

TRIP DETAILS CONT'D

AIRLINE GUIDLINES

You are allowed (1) checked-in bag 50 lbs max and no bigger than 62". You are allowed (1) carry-on 17 lbs max plus a purse or backpack. If you carry liquids in your carry on it can be no more than 3oz bottles and it all has to fit in a zip lock sandwich bag, only 1 bag per person.

* If you have to carry a second bag you will be charged 200.00 (100.00 each way). If you are only carrying one checked bag in you may be asked to take a second one for the medical team but the costs will be covered and you will be made aware of all contents. You will not be asked to take medication or chemicals; only Julia Daley will check those in.

DO I NEED A VISA?

Yes. Visas may be purchased upon arrival at the airport in Zimbabwe. The cost is \$35.00 per person (this has to be exact change). **Make sure your passports are NOT expiring in the next six months upon arrival, and you have at least 2 blank spaces per TSA.** In order to obtain a passport you can get a passport photo and carry it along with your certified birth certificate to your county court clerk. **The cost is \$165.**

WHAT ABOUT MEALS?

Breakfast comes with the room which usually consist of eggs, toast, sausage, juice and coffee. Lunch is up for grabs and usually consists of what we bring ourselves from the states (examples are given in the packing list). Dinner is sometimes provided as well which is usually rice & chicken, but there are times we just eat what we have brought ourselves. Pizza is available in the city along with other things (if time allows). We can go to the local grocery store and purchase things to be cooked and we do stock up on bottled waters & other drinks for the home we stay in. There is a microwave available where we stay.

- Life Expectancy : Male 51 years - Females 62 years
- Unemployment has reached 75% (2019 est) declined from 95% in 2012
- 68% of the population is below poverty level

TRANSPORTATION?

We all travel together in a mini bus with a hired driver. This is included in the estimated price.

WEATHER?

Zimbabwe has sub-tropical heat but we are going at the best time. The daily average will be 85 to 90 during the day and 70's at night. There are NO air conditioners, but we do have fans available at our lodgings.

ADAPTERS FOR ELECTRICITY?

Africa is on 220-voltage instead of our 110-voltage. Converters can be purchased at multiple stores (ie Walmart, Target, TJ Maxx, etc.)

- ___ Sunglasses
- ___ Cool Wraps
- ___ Sunscreen
- ___ Personal Medications (please submit list to team leaders and make sure your meds are in their original containers.)
- ___ Personal Toiletries
- ___ Baby Wipes and face wipes
- ___ Hand sanitizers
- ___ Insect Repellant
- ___ Towels and wash clothes
- ___ Blanket/Sleeping bag
- ___ Flash light
- ___ Extra batteries
- ___ Small fan (Optional)
- ___ Camera, Cell phone/Chargers
- ___ Snacks/lunch options -Anything you like to eat
- ___ Notepad and pens
- ___ Cash (No bills over \$20)

CAN I COMMUNICATE WITH THE US ON THIS MISSION TRIP?

We have a local cell phone that we can purchase minutes on to call home, or if you have a cell provider that offers it, but you will have to make those arrangements. The place we stay does offer WI-FI. Your family can be provided with ways to communicate with us from the states as well.

I, the undersigned, understand I will be traveling to a foreign country or countries and participating in various mission activities which are sponsored or facilitated, in whole or in part, by Going Global, Inc. non-profit corporations.

In consideration of my participation in said mission activities and as the recipient of benefits flowing from Going Global, Inc. as a sponsor and facilitator, and of other good and valuable consideration, I do hereby release, discharge, and agree to hold harmless Going Global, Inc. its directors, officers, members, administrators, employees, and/or other individuals associated with Going Global, Inc. from any and all liability, claims, demands or actions which may accrue as a result of any injury, whether accidental or otherwise, illness, or other loss which I may sustain as a result of participation in any of said mission travel, recreation or other trip activities. This release covers activities in any country. It covers activities involving travel: (1) to and from those countries; (2) to and from mission activity sites; (3) to and from various locales visited during the mission trip by any mode of transportation.

I further agree that I will not institute any action or suit at law, or in equity, against Going Global, Inc., its directors, officers, members, administrators, employees, and/or other individuals associated with Going Global, Inc., and I will not institute, prosecute, or in any way aid in the damages, costs, loss of services expenses or compensation for or on account of any alleged damage, loss, injury, health problem, disease or illness to any person or property, resulting from my participation in mission activities sponsored or facilitated by Going Global, Inc..

I understand and acknowledge that travel to, from, and within foreign countries involves unique hazards and risks not usually encountered when traveling within the United States. I understand that these unique risks and hazards may be related to exposure to environmental conditions, such as extreme weather, sanitation, animals, insects, or disease. I understand and acknowledge that I may be exposed to native food and drink that could increase the risk of a medical situation due to allergies or other pre-existing conditions.



LEGAL RELEASE CONT'D

I am not aware of any medical conditions that may heighten risks I encounter while participating in and/or traveling to mission activities on the mission trip. If I do suffer from such conditions, I have informed my Team Captains and Going Global, Inc. of these conditions. Furthermore, I have discussed any such conditions with my physician, as they relate to and/or impact my service during this trip.

I authorize Going Global, Inc. team leaders to use or disclose the medical information I have provided, deemed necessary in case of any emergency.

I acknowledge that my medical insurance is my primary coverage, and it is my responsibility to ensure that said insurance will cover possible medical needs, including pre-existing conditions, during my trip. This includes but is not limited to: medical treatment in a foreign country, medical treatment in a foreign health care facility, medical evacuation, and follow up or additional treatment upon my return to the United States. I understand and acknowledge that should a medical emergency arise during my trip, access to and treatment at a medical facility may be limited, and treatment I may receive may not be provided at levels found within the United States.

I understand and acknowledge that the nature of Going Global, Inc. mission trip to a foreign country may expose me to health conditions and/or illness or disease that may impact my health or cause harm while on the trip or after my return, and it is my responsibility to take necessary precautions such as vaccination, medication, or other preventative measures.

I understand and acknowledge that during travel to and from the trip, and while participating in activities on the field, I may experience stressful, difficult, and/or hazardous situations that could necessitate that I take additional precautions related to any pre-existing medical condition I may have.

I have taken the necessary steps to ensure that I can travel to and from the destination without legal restraint.

I have taken the necessary steps to ensure that any required professional documents or other certifications that are required for me to perform licensed or regulated activities in the medical, dental or other related professional fields have been provided to Going Global, Inc. I understand and agree that my service as a medical or dental professional may be regulated by government agencies in foreign countries. I agree to follow the requirements and guidelines set forth by Going Global, Inc. while serving on the mission field in a professional capacity to adhere to said regulations.

I understand and have been informed of the risks and hazards involved in participation and service on a foreign mission trip, and I willing to accept those risks.



MEDICAL/DENTAL REQUIREMENTS

- You must be 18 years of age work in the Dental/Medical Clinic
- You must be in good health
- You must read all information given to you
- You must have your Hepatitis B Vaccination

- You are informed that diseases such as TB, HIV/AIDS as well as other immune deficiency diseases are prevalent in the community where we will travel. Recommendations of TB testing are required by CDC upon the return of your trip (cost is \$7) free at the Health Department.

- In the clinic, you are required to wear a mask and gloves, as well as eye protection where warranted. In the make shift clinic, there is no running water or electricity. The conditions are the best that we can make them with regard to the safety of the patients and workers.

- Workers in the clinic are under a strict privacy policy. You are not allowed to repeat the status of a patient with regard to HIV/AIDS or any other disease. The welfare of the patient is first priority. Most are not aware of their own condition, so confidentiality is of the utmost importance.

- The undersigned is responsible for any and all wounds/injuries incurred while in the Dental Clinic, and fully takes responsibility for any future testing regarding the contraction of HIV/AIDS and/or COVID-19.

- The undersigned is aware of all dangers known and unknown that might arise as a consequence of working in the Medical/Dental Missions.

SUGGESTED SHOTS/MEDICINE

According to the CDC and international travel laws there are NO requirements for vaccinations ONLY suggestions to enter Zimbabwe. Up to date MMR, Tetanus and Hep B are required for all Dental/Medical workers.



ACCOMPLISHMENTS

We first visited Zimbabwe in 2004. Since 2006 we have invested over a half a million dollars in Zimbabwe that has built a Dental and Medical Facility that you will hear referred to as TJ's House; provided medicine, paid for surgeries, paid school fees, purchased an irrigation system, tractor, implements and a bus. In 2011 we did our first crusade and pastors conference and made history by being the first group allowed inside their prisons to minister. In June of 2012, we sent our first missionaries to stay for an extended period of time to help teach and build a chicken run that houses 1000+ chickens; two more have been built since then. In 2013 we established a church in Marondera, dug a well, built bath houses and provide dental and medical care remotely during our trips. We have provided housing for widows and children to get them off the streets.

God has given us favor with 4 local churches that we are able to minister to over the last 18 years. We have prayed for countless people seeing salvations, healings and deliverances. In 2019, we purchased a beautiful spot of land that backs up to a lion sanctuary that will be developed into our very own Mission House. Since then we have extended into Zambia, Ma-lawi, Kenya and Cameroon just to name a few. We have built relationships with men and women of God that will last a life time and you will too.
